Dwayne Zacharie has worked for the Kahnawake Peacekeepers since 1997. He is currently the Chief Peacekeeper. He is responsible for the administration of all policing functions. In 2013 he was elected President of the First Nations Chiefs of Police Association of Quebec and in 2016, he was elected President of the First Nations Chiefs of Police Association, a national organization that represents stand-alone First Nation

Police Services across Canada. Their roles are to build capacity in order to raise the standards of policing services offered to Native communities.

The Kahnawá:ke Peacekeepers' primary service is law enforcement within the Territory focusing on safety, protection and accountability as its key areas of concern. Daily tasks include patrols of the community ensuring that laws are being abided by, issuing tickets to offenders, responding to calls for assistance and promoting safety to the public.

The Mohawks of Kahnawá ke (Kahnawákeró non) are an ancient people with a vibrant culture and rich history. We are one of the eight communities that make up the Mohawk (Kanien keha'ka) Nation and have historic, political and cultural ties based on Honor, Trust and Respect to the Oneida, Seneca, Onondaga, Cayuga and Tuscarora Nations of the Northeastern part of North America. The present day site of Kahnawá ke, located approximately 10 kilometers from the city of Montreal,
